City of Hesperia Update (CITY)

- Main Street Improvement Project – the start date was delayed. The new start date is June 3rd.
- Housing – 165 single family home permits issued since July 1st.
- Update on the Recycled Water Pipeline Project as we reported last month – the pipeline is complete to the golf course; the reservoir construction is underway. We are anticipating recycled water delivery this summer.

Hesperia Unified School District Update (HUSD)

- The HUSD 8th grade student, Noah Cain, who was mentioned at the last meeting with all of the awards he won at the County science fair went on to take third place at the state level!
- HUSD's Clue-Me-In event on April 18 was a lot of fun. A lot of kids read a lot of books!
- Hesperia High hosted our second annual Special Prom on April 19. It went off incredibly well.
- The ICAN Film Festival on April 23 was better than ever. The movies are available to watch on the HUSD YouTube channel or Facebook page.
- VEX Robotics update – Maple Elementary went to Worlds and finished 23rd. The Sultana High School Vex Robotics team finished 16th in the Create U.S. Open Robotics Championship in Iowa. Hesperia High School did not place (only the top six teams advance), but made an impressive showing at the First Robotics Competition. Sultana High School's Skills USA team also won awards in their Competitions.
- Festival of the Arts – April 27 @ Rancho Middle School – always a fantastic show of student work.
- It's a Gas Celebration of Education in the High Desert on April 27 was great. Oak Hills High School students had not won any cars yet, but this year they won TWO.
- San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools, along with the San Bernardino County School Boards Association and County Communicators Network, recognized Eric Schmidt with the Education Medal of Honor in the Excellence in Education / Student Alumni category at their 2019 Spring Awards Dinner & Program on April 29.
- On May 2 we hosted our Experiential Learning Program Appreciation Night – HUSD has placed 24 students since February, and has 117 positions available for which students can apply to be part of

- internships and job shadowing. The Hesperia Unified School District is offering many of those positions, and has fifteen other businesses partnering with them.
- HUSD installed a wheelchair swing at Juniper Elementary, and the ribbon cutting ceremony was held on May 7. The smiles from the kids in the wheelchairs made it all worthwhile.
 - Eight HUSD schools will be partnering with a global collaborative of schools to increase deep learning. This includes schools from the United States, Uruguay, Australia, New Zealand, Finland, England, Singapore, and Canada.

Assemblyman Jay Obernolte's office (Mr. Christopher Scott)

- AB 21 will essentially exempt all veterans from the fee for obtaining the veteran's designation on their driver's licenses
- AB 1545 – California Small Business Regulatory Fairness Act – will permit State agencies to develop policies that will allow for reduction of penalties under certain circumstances
- Resolution HR 35 will implement a rule that the Committee Chair must bring bills up for at least a hearing – cannot just choose to overlook the bill
- May 25th – there will be a community coffee at the Spring Valley Lake Community Building in Victorville from 10 am – 11 am
